25.60 Draw, course N.

30.80 Desc. 272 ft. over NW. slope.

40.17 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 22 and 27, with brass cap mkd.
