49.70 Small spur, slopes NW.

63.00 Asc. 34 ft. over NW. slope.

65.00 Spur, slopes S.15*W., desc. 127 ft. over SW. slope
along spur.

68.20 Desc. 320 ft. over SE. slope.

80.21 Cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10.

Land; mountainous.

Soil; rocky, 4th rate.

Timber; fir, hemlock, pine, cedar, yew, madrona, oak
and alder.

Undergrowth; vinemaple, mountain laurel, rhododendron,
manzanita, hazel, buck brush, arrow-wood and
goose-berry.

10.00 Desc. 166 ft. over NE. slope.

18.70 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course E., asc. 24 ft. over SE. slope.

21.30 Spur, slopes E., desc. 62 ft. over NE. slope.

23.90 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course E., along gradual E. slope.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in
the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 32 and 33, with
brass cap mkd.
