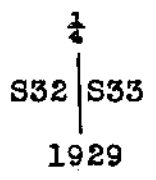

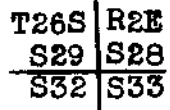

mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 33 B T

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S.43\*W., 17 lks. dist.,  
mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 32 B T

Desc. 61 ft. over gradual N. slope.

- 46.30 Draw, course NE., asc. 18 ft. over gradual SE. slope.
- 50.80 Spur, slopes NE., desc. 280 ft. over broken NE. slope.
- 72.10 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course NE., asc. 60 ft. over SE. slope.
- 77.20 Hole-in-the-Ground Trail, bears NE. and SW.
- 80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for the cor. of secs, 28, 29, 32, and 33, with brass cap mkd.

mkd. T 26 S R 2 E S 33 B T

A cedar, 20 ins. diam., bears S.39\*W., 26 lks. dist.,  
mkd. T 26 S R 2 E S 32 B T

A pine, 52 ins. diam., bears N.55\*W., 47 lks. dist.,  
mkd. T 26 S R 2 E S 29 B T

Land; mountainous. Soil; rocky, mountain loam, 4th rate.

Timber; fir, pine, cedar, hemlock, and yew.

Undergrowth; small fir, vinemaple, rhododendron, and arrow-wood.
