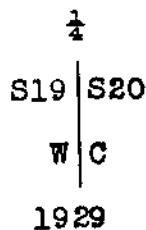
CHAINS

dense undergrowth.

- 1.80 Draw, course W., asc. 65 ft. over SW. slope.
- 5.40 Spur, slopes W., desc. 729 ft. over broken NW. slope.
- 23.20 Draw, course NW.,
- 26.40 Spur, slopes NW.,
- 29.40 Draw, course W.,
- 38.00 Left bank of North Umpqua River, course S.60*W.,
- 40.00 Right bank of river; point for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. impracticable
to set cor.
- 40.63 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in
