

General Description of T. 26 S., R. 2 E.

CHAINS

There are six H. E. S. claims in this township: Nos. 93, 142, 178, 182, 227 and 229. They are located on benches along the river; all but H. E. S. No. 229 are on the N. side. No. 227 is an addition to No. 142. There are no buildings on Nos. 93 and 227; all except No. 93 are being cultivated. These H. E. S. claims were located from U. S. L. M. No. 142, in Sec. 21, near the line bet. secs. 21 and 22, about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile S. of the cor. of secs. 15, 16, 21 and 22.

The forest service have a ranger station at Illahe.

The township is covered with a medium heavy growth of fir, cedar, hemlock, yew, and some alder, dogwood, and madrona, none of much commercial value. It is covered with medium undergrowth of vinemaple, hazel, rhododendron, mountain laurel, wild cherry, manzanita, huckleberry, buckbrush, chinuapin, gooseberry, and arrowwood.

There is fair grazing over a large portion of the Tp.

Glide, located about 45 miles down the river from Illahe, reached by trail and auto-road, is the nearest supply point and postoffice.

No indications of mineral were noted in this Tp.

The magnetic needle is very unreliable, practically useless, due to local attraction. The mean variation however, is about N. $21\frac{1}{2}$ *E.
