CHAINS

375 ft. over SE. slope.

46.10 Mountain Meadow Trail, and forest service telephone line, bears NE. and SW.

58.50 Spur, slopes S., desc, 209 ft. over SW. slope.

72.90 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course SE., asc. 90 ft. over SE. slope

79.94 The cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35 and 36.

Land; mountainous.

Soil; mountain loam, 3rd rate, and bottom land, 2nd rate.

Timber; fir, cedar, pine, chinquapin, and cottonwood.

Undergrowth; rhododendron, willow, vinemaple, salmon berry, and young fir.

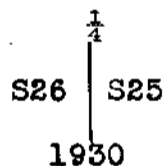
N.0°01'W., bet. secs. 25 and 26.

Asc. 128 ft. along broken SE. slope, through heavy timber and medium undergrowth.

26.10 Creek, $\frac{1}{2}$ lk. wide, at junction, course SE. from NW. and N. asc. 108 ft. along draw.

33.20 Leave draw, from NW., asc. 190 ft. over SW. slope.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.

A pine, 40 ins. diam., bears S.71°E., 115 lks. dist., mkd $\frac{1}{4}$ S 25 B T

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N.32°W., 43 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S 26 B T

Asc. 484 ft. over SW., changing to S. slope.

54.80 Ridge, bears NE. and SW., desc. 337 ft. over NE. slope.

71.10 Draw, course SE., asc. 60 ft. over SW., changing to S. slope.
