East on a random line bet. secs. 26 and 35.

40.00 Set a temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

79.90 Intersect N. and S. line, 3 lks. N. of cor. of secs.
25, 26, 35 and 36.

Thence

N.89*59*W., on true line bet. secs. 26 and 35.

Along broken S. slope, through medium timber and dense
undergrowth.

9.10 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course SE., asc. 235 ft. over NE.
slope.

24.90 Desc. 16 ft. over NW. slope.

27.90 Draw, course NE., asc. 166 ft. over SE. slope.

38.60 Spur, slopes S., desc, 28 ft. over SW. slope.

39.40 Draw, course SE., asc. 22 ft. over NE. slope.

39.95 A fir, 20 ins. diam., for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. mkd.

$\frac{1}{4}$ S 26 on N., and

S 35 on S. side.

A pine, 30 ins. diam., bears N.37*E., 110 lks.

dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S 26 B T

A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears S.33*W., 125 lks.

dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S 35 B T

Asc. 70 ft. over E. slope.

45.10 Way trail, bears NW. and SE.

46.00 Spur, slopes S., over gradual S. slope.

59.70 Desc. 237 ft. over W., changing to NW. slope.

79.90 The cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34, and 35.

Land; mountainous.

Soil; mountain loam, 3rd rate.

Timber; fir, cedar, pine, and chinquapin.

Undergrowth; manzanita, rhododendren, chinquapin,

vinemaple and young fir.
