40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

80.16 Intersect N. bdy. of Tp., 9 lks. E. of cor. of secs.
 2, 3, 34 and 35.

Thence

S.0*05'E., on true line bet. secs. 2 and 3.

Desc. 183 ft. over W., changing to SW. slope,
 through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

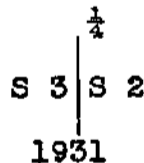
13.20 Creek, 4 lks. wide, course S.75*W.,

13.70 Spring, $\frac{1}{2}$ lk. wide, course NE., asc. 115 ft. over NW.,
 slope.

24.10 Spur, slopes W., desc, 97 ft. over broken SW. slope.

36.90 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N.10*W., asc. 33 ft. along
 E. slope, near creek.

40.16 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in
