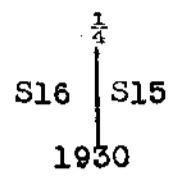

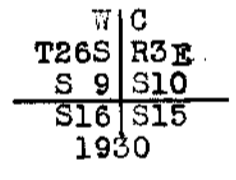

dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S 15 B T
- A cedar, 36 ins. diam., bears S.69*W., 13 lks.
dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S 16 B T

Asc. 91 ft. over SW. slope.

- 42.90 Spur, slopes SW., desc. 277 ft. over broken NW. slopes to true point for cor.
- 59.30 Small stream, course NW.,
- 73.40 Draw, course NW.,
- 79.50 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, for witness cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15 and 16, with brass cap mkd.

- A yew, 6 ins. diam., bears N.9*E., 98 lks.
dist., mkd. W C T 26 S R 3 E S 10 B T
- A fir, 56 ins. diam., bears S.12*E., 55 lks.
dist., mkd. W C T 26 S R 3 E S 15 B T
- A fir, 42 ins. diam., bears S.54*W., 56 lks.
dist., mkd. W C T 26 S R 3 E S 16 B T
- A hemlock, 10 ins. diam., bears N.17*W., 60 lks.
dist., mkd. W C T 26 S R 3 E S 9 B T

80.00 The true point for cor. falls near edge of Medicine Creek on insecure ground.

Land; mountainous. Soil; rocky, 4th rate.

Timber; fir, pine, hemlock, cedar, yew and dogwood.

Undergrowth; vinemapple, rhododendron, arrow wood, and dog wood.
