bearing E. and W., crosses the township near the center. The North Umpqua Trail, bearing NW. and SE., crosses the SW. part of the township. There are numerous way trails to other parts of the township. These trails lead through ever changing mountain scenery. Forest Service telephone lines follow the Mountain Meadow and the North Umpqua trails across the township.

"Bridge Prairie" in sec. 25, is a level piece of land containing about 30 acres of 1st rate agricultural soil, covered with a heavy growth of grass but no timber. There is a fair amount of grazing at Oak Flats, Pine Bench, and Bridge Prairie.

There are no settlers in this township. The shelter at Pine Bench being the only building of any nature.

There has been a great deal of survey work done around Tokettee Falls, for Power development.

No mineral, other than that in the water of Soda Springs, was noted.

The sportsman will find deer, bear, fish, and other game, in plenty in this township.

During the Summer there is a supply store and Post Office at Diamond Lake, about 25 miles to the SE., reached by a good mountain auto road, from the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. 35. Chemult, on The Dalles-California Highway, about 50 miles to the SE., by good mountain auto road, is the nearest supply store and Postoffice at all seasons of the year.

Due to local attraction the magnetic needle is practically useless, showing a range of from 15* to 25*E., with an average of about 21 $\frac{1}{2}$ *E.,
