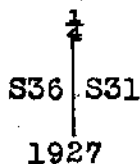

from which,

A pine, 14 ins. in dia., bears S.64 $\frac{1}{2}$ \*E., 32 lks. dist.,  
marked  $\frac{1}{2}$  S 31 B T.

A fir, 18 ins. in dia., bears N.18 $\frac{1}{2}$ \*W., 8 lks. dist.,  
marked  $\frac{1}{2}$  S 36 B T.

Descend 260 ft. over NW. slope.

57.00 Descend 177 ft. over N. slope.

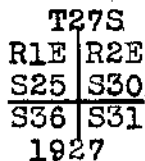
64.60 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course W.

Ascend 382 ft. over SW. slope.

76.00 Ridge, bears E. and W.

Descend 84 ft. over NW. slope.

80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 16 ins. in  
the ground to bedrock, supported in a mound of stone,  
for the co. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, with brass cap  
marked.

A fir, 8 ins. in dia., bears N.47\*E., 44 lks. dist.,  
marked T 27 S R 2 E S 30 B T.

A fir, 16 ins. in dia., bears S.57\*E., 36 lks. dist.,  
marked T 27 S R 2 E S 31 B T.

A fir, 30 ins. in dia., bears S.16\*W., 50 lks. dist.,  
marked T 27 S R 1 E S 36 B T.

A pine, 14 ins. in dia., bears N.40 $\frac{1}{2}$ \*W., 27 lks. dist.,  
marked T 27 S R 1 E S 25 B T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky loam, 3rd rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, pine and cedar.

Undergrowth, rhododendron, huckleberry and vine maple.
