

Survey of the East Boundary of T 27 S., R. 1 E.

CHAINS

A fir, 14 ins. in dia., bears S.17*E., 13 lks. dist.,
marked T 27 S R 2 E 30 B T.

A fir, 16 ins. in dia., bears S.70*W., 22 lks. dist.,
marked T 27 S R 1 E S 25 B T.

A fir, 34 ins. in dia., bears N.18*W., 155 lks. dist.,
marked T 27 S R 1 E S 24 B T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky loam, 3rd rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, pine and cedar.

Undergrowth, huckleberry, rhododendron, vine maple and
willow.

North, bet. secs. 19 and 24.

Over mountainous land, through timber and dense under-
growth.

Descend 653 ft. over N. slope.

2.53 Twin Lake Trail, and telephone line, bear E. and W.

17.55 Small stream, 1 lk. wide, course NE.

Thence, along E. slope.

24.00 Small stream, 3 lks. wide, course NW.

25.90 Same stream, course NE.

29.80 Branch of Calf Creek, 4 lks. wide, course NW.

Ascend 127 ft. over broken SW. slope.

40.00 Small spur, slopes NW.

A fir, 36 ins. in dia., for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., I mark

S 19 on E., and

$\frac{1}{4}$ S 24 on W., side;

from which,

A fir, 18 ins. in dia., bears N.75*E., 20 lks. dist.,
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 19 B T.

A fir, 24 ins. in dia., bears N.80*W., 20 lks. dist.,
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 24 B T.
