CHAINS

- Descend 57 ft. over NW. slope.
- 48.20 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course W.  
Ascend 114 ft. over SW. slope.
- 58.60 Spur, slopes W.  
Descend 195 ft. over NW. slope.
- 70.00 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course W.
- 77.40 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course W.
- 80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 27 ins. in  
the ground, for the cor. of secs. 13,18,19 and 24,  
with brass cap marked.

A fir, 26 ins. in dia., bears N.49\*E., 80 lks. dist.,  
marked T 27 S R 2 E S 18 B T.

A fir, 12 ins. in dia., bears S.74\*E., 27 lks. dist.,  
marked T 27 S R 2 E 19 B T.

A fir, 8 ins. in dia., bears S.11 $\frac{1}{2}$ \*W., 13 lks. dist.,  
marked T 27 S R 1 E S 24 B T.

A fir, 22 ins. in dia., bears N.52 $\frac{1}{2}$ \*W., 49 lks. dist.,  
marked T 27 S R 1 E S 13 B T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky loam, 3rd rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, pine and cedar.

Undergrowth, huckleberry, rhododendron, vinemapple and  
willow.

North, bet. secs. 13 and 18.

Over mountainous land, through timber and dense under-  
growth.

Descend 844 ft. over broken N. slope.
