- 68.70 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course NE.
- 71.40 Creek, 5 lks. wide, course SE.
- 74.85 Quartz Creek Way Trail, bears SE. and NW.
- 80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 27 ins. in the ground, for the cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35 and 36, with brass cap marked.

A fir, 12 ins. in dia., bears N.39½*W., 55 lks. dist., marked T 27 S R 1 E S 26 B T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky loam, 3rd rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, pine and cedar.

Undergrowth, rhododendron, huckleberry and vine maple.

East on a random line bet. secs. 25 and 36.

40.00 Set. temp. ¼ sec. cor.

80.24 Intersect the E. bdy. of the Tp. 30 lks. N. of the cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, hereinbefore described,

Thence,

N.89*47'W., on a true line bet. secs. 25 and 36.

Over mountainous land, through timber and brush.
