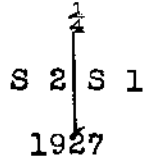
Draw, course SE.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 27 ins. in the ground, for the $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked

A fir, 26 ins. in dia., bears N.73*E., 16 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S 1 B T.

A fir, 36 ins. in dia., bears S.79*W., 23 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S 2 B T.

Descend 105 ft. over SE. slope.

Draw, course NE.
Ascend 378 ft. over NE. slope.

Ridge, bears E. and W.
Descend 240 ft. over SW. slope.

The cor. of secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12.
Land, mountainous.
Soil, rocky loam, 3rd rate.
Timber, fir, hemlock, pine and cedar.
Undergrowth, rhododendron, chinquapin and second growth timber.

From the standard cor. of secs. 34 and 35 on the S. bdy. of the Tp. as described in the field notes of Tp. 28 S R 1 E.

N.0*02'W., bet. secs. 34 and 35.

Over mountainous land, through timber and brush.

Descend 219 ft. over broken NE. slope.
