CHAINS

Fir, hemlock and cedar are found throughout this township and can be classed as merchantable timber. Pine, yew, alder, maple and cascara are also found in scattering portions of this township.

The township is well watered by Little River and its tributaries and Calf Creek which flow into the North Umpqua River and by Quartz Creek which flows into the South Umpqua River.

There are no settlers located in this township but Quartz Mountain Ranger Station is located in the SE. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NW. $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 28. There are also four other forest service shanties and camp sites. Snow Bird Camp in the NE. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NE. $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 26, Limpy Prairie Camp in the north central part of sec. 10, Hemlock Island Camp in the central part of the SE. $\frac{1}{4}$ of sec. 28, and Fairy Camp in the north central part of sec. 5.

Glide is the closest outfitting point and post office about 36 miles by trail from the Quartz Mountain Ranger Station.

This township is traversed by numerous trails, the best of which are, Emile Trail entering the township near the NW. corner, traversing the township in a south easterly direction and leaving the township near the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 25 and 30 on the east boundary, and Red Butte Trail that enters near the SE. cor., traverses in a north easterly direction to Quartz Mountain Ranger Station, thence east to a junction with the Emile Trail at Snow Bird Camp. Forest service telephone lies parallel these trails,

This township is a hunters paradise, being well stocked with deer and bear.

The magnetic variation in this township varies from N.18°E., to N.25°E. The mean magnetic variation for this township is N.21 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E.
