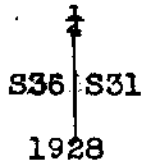


East Boundary of T. 27 S., R. 2E.

dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 31 B T

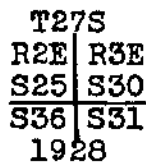
A fir, 14 ins. in diam., bears N.63*W., 35 lks.
dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 36 B T

Ascend 900 ft. over broken S. slope.

45.40 Small spur, slopes SW.

66.15 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course S.60*W.

80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins, in diam., 27 ins. in
the ground, for cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, with
brass cap marked

dist., marked T 27 S R 3 E S 30 B T

A fir, 14 ins. in diam., bears S.53*E., 163 lks.
dist., marked T 27 S R 3 E S 31 B T

A pine, 18 ins. in diam., bears S.69*W., 92 lks.
dist., marked T 27 S R 2 E S 36 B T

A fir, 16 ins. in diam., bears N.29*W., 106 lks.
dist., marked T 27 S R 2 E S 25 B T
