A fir, 34 ins. diam., bears S.85*W., 90 lks.,
dist., marked T 27 S R 2 E S 25 B T.

A pine, 7 ins. diam., bears N.18*W., 130 lks.,
dist., marked T 27 S R 2 E S 24 B T.

Land; mountainous.

Soil; loose, coarse, rocky loam, 3rd rate.

Timber; fir, hemlock, pine, and cedar.

Undergrowth; vinemaple, rhododendron, chinquapin, and
hazel.

North, bet secs. 19 and 24

Over mountainous land, through timber and dense
undergrowth.

Descend 30 ft. over N. slope.

1.15 Draw, course NW.

Ascend 24 ft over S. slope.

4.20 Spur, slopes W.,

Descend 630 ft. over broken NW. slope.,

31.00 Head of draw, course N.15*W.,
