Land, mountainous.

Soil, loose, coarse rocky loam; 3rd rate.

Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Pine and Cedar.

Undergrowth, Vinemaple, Rhododendron, Chinquapin and
Hazel.

North, bet. Secs. 1 and 6.

Over mountainous land, through heavy green timber and
dense undergrowth.

Descend 870 ft. over broken NW slope.

12.20 Spur, slopes N.20*W., slope changes to NE.

27.50 Small spur, slopes NE., slope changes to N.

37.40 Spring branch, 4 lks. wide, course N.60*W.

Ascend 105 ft. over SW slope.

40.00 Set a Basalt stone, 22x16x12 ins., 16 ins. in the
ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor. of Secs. 1 and 6, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on
W face, from which

A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.62*E., 50 lks.
dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 6 B T.

A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.20*W., 30 lks.
dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 1 B T.

Ascend 50 ft. over SW slope.

44.90 Spur, slopes SW.

Descend 225 ft. over broken NW slope.

49.90 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course N.10*W.

63.90 Main trail, bears NE to North Umpqua River, and SW to
Copeland Creek.

67.00 Draw, course N.60*W.

Ascend 130 ft. over broken SW slope.

77.80 Spur, slopes NW.
