Soil, loose, coarse, rocky loam, 3rd rate.  
Timber, fir, hemlock, pine, cedar, madrona and oak.  
Under growth, vinemaple, rhododendron and chinquapin.

S.89\*53'W., on a true line bet. secs. 6 and 31.

Over mountainous land, through heavy green timber and dense undergrowth.

Descend 110 ft. over broken SW. slope, over loose rock.

9.00 Steep, spur, slopes S.

18.10 Spur, slopes SW.

Descend 900 ft. over broken W. slope, over series of rock bluffs on precipitous slope.

24.00 Leave timber, bears N. and S.

31.50 Enter timber, bears N. and S.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., with brass cap marked

79.35 The cor. of Tps. 26 and 27 S., Rs. 1 and 2 E., which is an iron post, 3 ins. in diam., protruding 9 ins. above ground, firmly set, with brass cap marked
