Along broken S. slope.

43.10 Small spur, slopes SW.

Descend 945 ft. over broken SW. slope.

68.40 Creek, 8 lks. wide, course NW.

Ascend 205 ft. over NE. slope

75.60 Spur, slopes N.

Descend 160 ft. over NW. slope.

80.16 Cor. of secs. 13, 14, 23, and 24.

Land; mountainous.

Soil; loose, coarse, rocky loam, 3rd rate.

Timber; fir, pine, cedar, and hemlock.

Undergrowth; chinquapin and rhododendron.

N.0*01'W., bet. secs. 13 and 14

Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and
dense undergrowth

1.80 R. bank of Copeland Creek, course N.15*E.,

5.60 L. bank of Copeland Creek, course N.15*E.

Ascend 440 ft. over broken SE. slope.

11.60 Copeland Creek Way Trail, bears NE. and SW.

32.20 Spur, slopes E.

Descend 273 ft. over NE. slope.

39.20 Small stream, 1 lk. wide, course E.,

Ascend 15 ft. over SE. slope.

40.00 A boulder in place, 3x2x2 ft. above ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec.
cor. I mark with a cross (X) on top at exact cor.
point and $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face.

from which,

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N.20*E., 48 lks.,
dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 13 B T.

A fir, 26 ins. diam., bears S.83*W., 28 lks., dist.,
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 14 B T.
