40.00	Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
80.26	Intersect E. bdy. of Tp. 14 lks. S. of the cor. of secs. 7, 12, 13, and 18, hereinbefore described. Thence N.89*47'W., on true line bet. secs. 12 and 13. Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth Descend 700 ft. over broken SW. slope.
19.80	Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course SW.
37.10	Copeland Creek, 30 lks. wide, course N.
40.13	Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked <div style="text-align: center;"> $\begin{array}{c} S12 \\ \frac{1}{4} S13 \\ 1929 \end{array}$ </div> from which, A fir, 22 ins. diam., bears N.16*E., 53 lks., dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 12 B T. A cedar, 18 ins. diam., bears S.66*E., 20 lks., dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 13 B T.
41.30	Copeland Creek Way Trail, bears NE. and SW. Ascend 660 ft. over broken E. slope.
65.50	Spur, slopes SE., from W., ascend spur.
73.80	Leave spur, slopes E. from NW. Descend 70 ft. over SW. slope.
80.26	The cor. of secs. 11, 12, 13, and 14. Land; mountainous. Soil; loose, coarse, rocky loam, 3rd rate. Timber; cedar, hemlock, pine, and fir. Undergrowth; chinquapin, rhododendron, vinemaple, and second growth timber.
