CHAINS

- 22.60 W. edge of meadow, bears N. and S.
- 30.50 Draw, course S.
- 40.02 A fir, 8 ins. diam., for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. I mark
 $\frac{1}{4}$ S 2 on N.
 S 11 on S., sides.
 from which.
 A fir, 5 ins. diam., bears S.15*E., 32 lks.,
 dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 11 P T.
 A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.4*W., 38 lks.,
 dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 2 B T.
 Along broken S. slope.
- 51.60 Draw, course S.
 Descend 120 ft. over SW. slope.
- 60.50 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course SE.
 Ascend 265 ft. over NE. slope.
- 80.04 Cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10, and 11.
 Land; mountainous.
 Soil; loose, coarse, rocky loam, 3rd rate.
 Timber; fir, hemlock, cedar, and pine.
 Undergrowth; vinemaple, rhododendron, and chinquapin.
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- 40.00 N.0*02*W., on a random line bet. secs. 2 and 3
 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
- 81.18 Intersect N. bdy. of Tp., 16 lks. E. of cor. of
 secs. 2, 3, 34, and 35, as hereinbefore described.
 Thence,
 S.0*09'E., on a true line bet. secs. 2 and 3.
 Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and
 dense undergrowth.
 Ascend 30 ft. over NE. slope.
- 3.20 Low spur, slopes E.
 Descend 14 ft. over broken SE. slope.
- 7.30 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course NE.
- 8.50 Draw, course N.20*E.
 Ascend 260 ft. over NE. slope.
