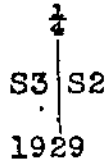
CHAINS

Ridge, bears NW. and SE., Copeland Creek Way Trail,  
by lower junction, along ridge.

Descend 90 ft. over SW. slope.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 10 ins. in  
ground to bedrock, supported by mound of stone, 3 ft.  
base, 2 ft. high, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 2 and 3,  
with brass cap marked

A fir, 26 ins. diam., bears N.24\*E., 27 lks.  
dist. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 2 B T.

A fir, 7 ins. diam., bears N.36\*W., 38 lks.,  
dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 3 B T.

Descend 825 ft. over broken S. slope.

Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course SE.

Creek, 4 lks. wide, course SE.

Ascend 135 ft. over NE. slope.

Cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10, and 11.

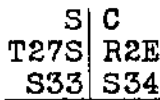
Land; mountainous.

Soil; loose, coarse, rocky loam, 3rd rate.

Timber; fir, cedar, pine, hemlock, and yew.

Undergrowth; vinemaple, rhododendron, and chinquapin.

From the standard cor. of secs. 33 and 34 on S. bdy. of  
Tp., which is an iron post, 2 ins diam., 9 ins.  
above ground, firmly set, with brass cap marked
