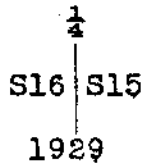


Subdivisions, T. 27 S., R. 2 E.

from which,

A fir, 12 ins. in diam., bears N.69*E., 106 lks.
dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 15 B T

A fir, 16 ins. in diam., bears S.38*W., 111 lks.
dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 16 B T

Ascend 335 ft. over S slope.

60.20 Twin Lakes Way Trail, bears E. and W.

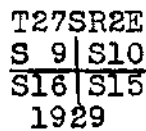
62.90 Top of spur, slopes E.

Descend 90 ft. over N. slope, changing to E. slope.

67.60 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course NE.

71.60 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course NE.

80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in diam., 27 ins. in
the ground, for cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15 and 16, with
brass cap marked

A fir, 18 ins. in diam., bears N.29*E., 57 lks.
dist., marked T 27 S R 2 E S 10 B T

A fir, 8 ins. in diam., bears S.31*E., 39 lks.
dist., marked T 27 S R 2 E S 15 B T

A fir, 8 ins. in diam., bears S.43*W., 22 lks.
dist., marked T 27 S R 2 E S 16 B T

A fir, 8 ins. in diam., bears N.65*W., 7 lks.
dist., marked T 27 S R 2 E S 9 B T

Land, mountainous.

Soil, loose, coarse, rocky loam, 3rd rate.

Timber, fir, pine and hemlock.

Undergrowth, snowbrush, vinemaple, rhododendron and
chinquapin.
