A pine, 20 ins. in diam., bears N.72\*W., 23 lks.

dist., marked  $\frac{1}{2}$  S 5 B T

Ascend 410 ft. over broken NE. slope.

50.30 Enter bench, bears E. and W., drains NE.

58.30 Leave bench, bears E. and W., drains NE.

66.70 Deception Creek Way Trail, bears NW. and SE.,

69.70 Top of cliff, 140 ft. high, bears NW. and SE., faces NE.

70.10 Spur, slopes NW.

Descend 200 ft. over SW. slope.

70.50 W. end of bluff, 140 ft. high, bears NW. and SE., faces SW.

80.36 The cor. of secs. 4, 5, 8 and 9.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, loose, coarse, rocky loam, 3rd rate.

Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, pine and yew.

Undergrowth, vinemaple, rhododendron, chinquapin and second growth timber.

From the standard cor. of secs. 31 and 32 on the S. bdy. of the Tp., which is an iron post, 2 ins. in diam., protruding 9 ins. above ground, firmly set, with brass cap marked
