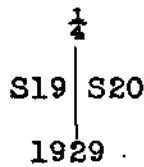


Subdivisions, T. 27 S., R. 2 E.

CHAINS



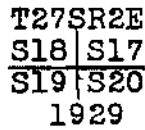
from which,

A fir, 20 ins. in diam., bears N.53 $\frac{1}{2}$ *E., 15 lks.
dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 20 B T

A fir, 12 ins. in diam., bears N.81*W., 35 lks.
dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 19 B T

Continue along broken E. slope.

- 57.00 Descend 640 ft. over broken N. slope.
- 66.55 Twin Lakes Trail, and telephone line, bears NW. and E.
- 70.15 Draw, course NW.
- 71.15 Same draw, course NE.
- 80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs 17, 18, 19 and 20, with brass cap marked



from which,

A fir, 14 ins. in diam., bears N.15*E., 59 lks.
dist., marked T 27 S R 2 E S 17 B T

A fir, 50 ins. in diam., bears S.37*E., 6 lks.
dist., marked T 27 S R 2 E S 20 B T

A fir, 14 ins. in diam., bears S.55*W., 71 lks.
dist., marked T 27 S R 2 E S 19 B T

A hemlock, 32 ins. in diam., bears N.14*W., 84 lks.
dist., marked T 27 S R 2 E S 18 B T

Land, mountainous.

Soil, loose, coarse, rocky loam, 3rd rate.

Timber, fir, cedar, pine and hemlock.

Undergrowth, vinemapple, mountain ash, and second growth
fir and yew.
