42.94 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 30 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked.

62.00 Ridge, bears NW. and SE., descend 35 ft. over SW. slope.

69.50 Swale, 100 lks. wide, drains NW., ascend 90 ft. over NE. slope.

77.50 Spur, bears E., descend 70 ft. over SE. slope to

82.94 The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10.

Land, mountainous.
