Land, rough and mountainous, covered with dense forests  
of pine and fir.

Thick underbrush of pine and fir.

Soil, 4th rate.

General Description

This township lies mostly on the western slope of the Cascade Range of Mountains, is high and mountainous and is covered with a fine growth of pine, fir and spruce timber. Undergrowth, principally pine and fir. The Northern part dry. Soil, poor. Southern part is well watered. Diamond Lake is a fine body of water, covering about 5000 acres.

Oct. 1998 corrections were made to this set of line notes. When originally typed an error was made on page 10139 concerning the BTs for the 1/4 corner between Secs. 6 & 31 (the Township corner BTs were given instead of the 1/4 cor. BTs) The error was corrected 10/12/1998 by the DCSO (JC)
