	<p>of the South Boundary of T. 27 S., R. 6 E., running East. Diamond Lake includes most of Secs. 31 and 32, land around the lake is excellent for grass; and on the ridges about third and fourth rate. Timber, fir, hemlock and pine; underbrush, dense vine maple, etc. Mt. Thielson lies South of the line opposite secs. 34 and 35, estimated distance about a mile from our line to summit of mountain. In sec. 36 we cross the summit of the Cascade Range estimated at 7000 feet. We find no other topographical characteristics of interest on the North or South side of our line in R. 6 E.</p>
