Commencing on West Boundary of T. 27 S., R. 6 E.

I commenced at the meander cor. to fractional secs. 25 and 30 on West boundary of township, which is a post 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sqr., set firmly in the ground, marked M C with T 27 S on N., R 6 E S 30 on E. and R 5 E S 25 on W. faces, from which
 A pine, 24 ins. diam., bears S.80*E., 74 lks. dist.
