Land, hilly, dense timber and thick brush of pine and fir. Soil, 2nd. rate.

General Description

This township is high and mountainous being on the western slope of the Cascade Range of Mountains and contains a fine growth of valuable pine, fir and spruce timber. The underbrush is principally pine and fir. The northern part is destitute of water and the soil is 4th rate. The southern part is well watered and soil, 2nd. and 3rd. rate.

Diamond Lake is a fine body of water, covering about 5000 acres. The scenery about the lake is fine, and will at no very distant day be settled.
