General Description of the S. bdy. of

T. 27 S., R. 6 1/2 E., running east.

The land from summit of mountain ridge east is 4th rate. Forest of timber on this slope is principally black pine. The forest is not so dense, nor is the timber so valuable as most of the ranges through which we have passed.

There is no topography on either side of the line in this range worthy of special notice. It is merely the eastern slope of the Cascade range of mountains.
