

Subdivisions of T. 27 S. R. 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ E.
Meanders- Fish Lake.

CHAINS

Closing at the meander cor. of fract. secs. 13 and 14, which is a post 48 ins. by 4 ins. sq., marked M C T 27 S R 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ E S 13 on E. S 14 on W. and M C on N. face, from which:

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S.53*E., 5 lks.

dist., marked T 27 S R 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ E S 13 M C B T

A pine, 7 ins. diam., bears S.20*W., 3 lks.

dist., marked T 27 S R 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ E S 14 M C B T

Edge of lake rocky and rough, covered with fallen timber and thick underbrush of gooseberry and huckleberry.

General Description

The whole of this township is mountainous, lying on the East slope of the Cascade Mountains, and is covered with pine, fir and hemlock timber, of good quality. The underbrush is principally pine and fir. The southern part is well watered with clear cold mountain streams, but the Northern part is exceedingly dry. The Lake abounds with fish, and its banks are rough and rocky and covered with pine and fir timber.
