CHAINS

East on S. boundary of Sec. 36.

Var. 17°45'E.

8.50 Summit of Spur.

Descend ridge.

40.00 Set post, 44x4 ins. firmly in the ground, for stan. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec.

Cor. marked S C on N. & S. faces, from which

A Pine, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 30° E., 4 lks.

dist., marked S. C. $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A Hemlock, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 35° E., 7 lks.

dist., marked S C $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

77.18 Intersect West shore of Diamond Lake. Set meander

post 50x4 ins. firmly in the ground for stan. meander

cor. marked S M Cor. T 27 S R 5 E on N, R 5 E S 36

on E, and R 5 E S 36 on W, faces, from which

A Pine, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 35° W., 74 lks.

dist., marked T 27 S R 5 E S 36 (M P) B T.

A Pine, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 70° W., 129 lks.

dist., marked M P T 27 S R 5 E S 36 B T.

Land, second rate, near the lake.

Timber, principally pine and fir.

Thick undergrowth of fir, pine, laurel and manzanita.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

Of the South boundary of T. 27 South, R. 5 East, running

East. Land on this line fourth rate. Mountain

ridge high and rocky. Estimated at 5,000 feet, cov-

ered with snow. Timber, fir, hemlock and pine.

Underbrush dense, manzanita, fir and pine.

A mountain known as "Old Balley" situated SW. from sec.

34, supposed to be $1\frac{1}{2}$ or 2 miles dist. from our line.

I know of nothing of special interest on the north side

our line in this range. After passing the high ridge

leading NE. from Old Balley, we pass down to Diamond

Lake, intersecting lake at 77.18 chs. in Sec. 36.
