Sixth Standard Parallel South, through R. 4 E.

CHAINS

General Description.

Of the south boundary of T. 27 South, R. 4 East, running East. Land averages about third rate. Ridges are high, mountainous and rocky. Timber, fir, spruce, hemlock and pine; abundant and of good quality.

Variation fluctuates from 16\* to 22\* East. Underbrush, vine maple, laurel, fir and pine.

Clear creek is 75 lks. wide, and runs through sec. 31.

The grass in the vicinity of this creek is abundant and of excellent quality. It has been named "Mule Heaven."

There is no topography on the North or South side of this line, which is worthy of special notice. Mountain ridges and timber are the prominent objects.
