GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Of the South Boundary of T 27 S., R 1 E., running East.

Land will average about 4th rate, mountainous and rocky.

Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Spruce and Pine, of a good quality and abundant.

Underbrush, dense of Fir, Vine Maple, Mountain Laurel and Cinnamon.

The principal object of interest on the South side of the

line is "Quartz Mountain" bearing from the $\frac{1}{4}$ post, on

South Boundary of Sec. 35, S.25*E., about 20 chs. dist.

On North side of line the country as far as discernible,

is mountainous, broken and similar to the ground over

which the line passes heavily timbered and well watered.
