East, on a Random line between Secs. 28 and 33.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

80.00 Intersect N. and S. line, 7 lks. N. of cor. of Secs. 27, 28, 33 and 34.

Thence

N.89*57'W., on a True line between Secs. 28 and 33.

Asc. 5 ft. over SE. slope, through heavy green timber and dense undergrowth.

2.00 Spur, slopes S., desc. 705 ft. over SW. slope.

32.15 Branch, 3 lks. wide, C. SW., asc. 55 ft. over SE. slope.

36.50 Spur, slopes S., desc. 25 ft. over SW. slope.

38.50 Ravine, C. S.20*E., asc. 50 ft. over SE. slope.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap, mkd.:
