1.00 Spur, slopes SW.; desc. 200 ft. over SW. slope.

5.15 Ravine, course SW.; asc. 15 ft. over SE. slope.

6.10 Rocky point, slopes S.; desc. 180 ft. over SW. slope.

18.60 Spur, slopes S.; desc. 450 ft. over SW. slope.

30.05 Branch, 4 lks. wide, course S. 15* E.; asc. 415 ft. over NE. slope.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in. the ground, for 1/4 sec. cor., with brass cap, mkd.

71.35 Spur, slopes S. 20* W.; desc. 90 ft. over SW. slope.

77.26 Intersect the Willamette Meridian at the point for closing cor. of secs. 7 and 18, hereinbefore described.
