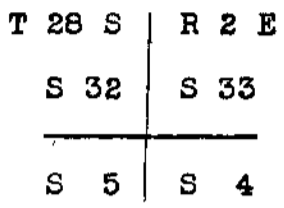


North Boudry of T. 29 S. R. 2 E.

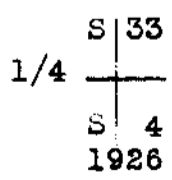
