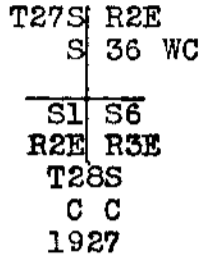


East Boundary of T. 28 S. R. 2 E.

CHAINS

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for witness cor. to closing cor. of Tps. 28 S., Rs. 2 and 3 E., with brass cap mkd:



from which:

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.54\*E., 88 lks. dist., mkd. WC T 28 S R 3 E S 6 C C B T

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.10\*W., 16 lks. dist., mkd. WC T 28 S R 2 E S 1 C C B T

Land, mountainous.  
Soil, loose, coarse, rocky loam; 3rd. rate.  
Timber; fir, pine and cedar.  
Undergrowth, vine maple and rhododendron.

West Bdy. T 28 S R 2 E

From the cor. of Tps. 28 and 29 S., Rs. 1 and 2 E., previously described in field notes of T. 29 S., R. 2 E., this group.

North, on a true line, bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Desc. 180 ft. over NW. slope; through heavy green timber and dense undergrowth.

3.70 Foot of descent; enter bottom land, bears NE. and SW.

8.65 Left bank of South Umpqua River, course S.75\*W.

10.65 Right Bank of South Umpqua River.

11.75 Trail, bears E. and W., leave bottom land, bears NE. and SW., asc. 475 ft. over SE. slope.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.



from which:

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.47 $\frac{1}{2}$ \*E., 33 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 31 B T

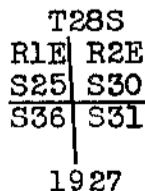
A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S.72\*W., 63 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 36 B T

Asc. 480 ft. over broken SE. slope to spur.

69.00 Head of ravine, course S.60\*E.

80.00 Spur, slopes S.E.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, with brass cap mkd.
