CHAINS

Timber, fir, pine and cedar.

Undergrowth, rhododendron, vine maple and chinquapin.

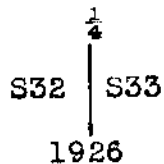
From the cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32 and 33, on S. bdy. of Tp., previously described in field notes of T. 29 S., R. 2 E., this group.

North 0° 3' W., bet. secs. 32 and 33.

Desc. 480 ft. over NW. slope; through heavy green timber and dense undergrowth.

31.55 Branch, 2 lks. wide, course NW., asc. 155 ft. over SW. slope.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.

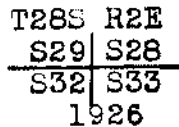
A cedar, 36 ins. diam., bears S. 68° E., 54 lks.
dist. mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S 33 B T

A pine, 32 ins. diam., bears N. 57° W., 27 lks.
dist. mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S32 BT.

Asc. 140 ft. over SW. slope.

49.75 Spur, slopes NW., desc. 700 ft. over broken NW. slope.

80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32 and 33, with brass cap mkd.

A pine, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 50 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E., 52 lks.
dist., mkd. T28S R2E S28 B T.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 26 $\frac{1}{2}$ ° E., 51 lks.
dist., mkd. T28S R2E S33 BT.
