55.50 Spur, slopes SE., desc. 130 ft. over SW. slope.

64.60 Branch, 1 lk. wide, course SE., asc. 360 ft. over NE.  
slope.

80.20 The cor. of secs. 20, 21, 28 and 29.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, loose, coarse, rocky loam; 3rd. rate.

Timber, fir, pine and cedar.

Undergrowth, vine maple, rhododendron, hazel,  
manzanita and poison oak.

North 0\*3'W., bet. secs. 20 and 21.

Desc. 110 ft. over NE. slope to branch; through heavy  
green timber and dense undergrowth.

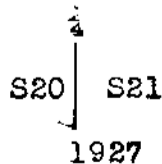
9.95 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course E.

12.85 Spring branch, 1 lk. wide, course E.

15.60 Branch, 2 lks. wide, course SE., asc. 105 ft. over SW.  
slope.

39.85 Spur, slopes SE., Five Lakes Trail, bears NW. and SE.  
Thence over E. slope.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in  
the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.
