	A larch, 16 ins. diam., bears N.78*W., 44 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 2 B T. Desc. 40 ft. over N. slope.
43.80	Creek, 3 lks. wide, course NE., asc. 170 ft. over SE. slope.
58.75	Spur, slopes E., desc. 25 ft. over NE. slope.
62.50	Creek, 2 lks. wide, course SE., asc. 130 ft. over SE. slope to C C., enter dense undergrowth.
74.05	Intersect the 6th Standard Parallel South, at the closing cor. of secs. 1 and 2, which bears West, 5.14 chs. dist. from the standard cor. of secs. 35 and 36., and is hereinbefore described.  Land, mountainous.  Soil, sandy and gravelly, 2nd rate.  Timber, fir, pine, hemlock, and larch.  Undergrowth, snow brush, huckle berry, vine maple, small fir, pine, and hemlock.
	From the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34, and 35, on S. bdy. of the township, which is an iron post, 2 ins. diam., projecting 5 ins. above a mound of stone, with brass cap marked and witnessed as described in the field notes of T. 29 S., R. 3 E.  N.0*02'W., bet. secs. 34 and 35.  Asc. 175 ft. over SW. slope, through heavy timber and light undergrowth.
5.35	Spur, slopes W., desc. 50 ft. over NW. slope.
8.67	Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, course W., asc. 225 ft. over broken SW. slope.
22.60	Rocky spur, slopes W., thence over broken W. slope.
30.65	Spur, slopes W., desc. 320 ft. over NW. slope to $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
31.35	Castle Rock, bears East, 5.00 chs. dist.
40.00	Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 30 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked
