mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S 4 B T

40.75 Wire fence bears N. and S. Enter enclosure of U. S.
Forest station.

Enter opening.

54.00 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course S.

58.00 Leave opening.

60.15 Wire fence bears N. and S. Leave enclosure of U. S.
Forest station.

80.00 Point for cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34 falls on exposed
bedrock, on which I
Cut a cross, (x) at exact cor. point, with 3 notches
E. and W. of cross, from which,
A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N.23*E., 40 lks. dist.,
