43.00	Ridge, bears E. and W.
54.00	Ravine, course SE.
58.70	Trail to Ackers, bears E. and W.
64.00	<p>Divide bet. N. and S. forks of South Umpqua River bears E. and W.</p> <p>Descend N. slope.</p>
77.85	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course NE.
80.00	<p>A Fir, 6 ins. diam., for corner of Secs. 27, 28, 33 and 34, I mark T 29 S S 27 on NE, R 1 E S 34 on SE, S 33 on SW, and S 28 on NW side, with 1 notch on S and 3 notches on E side, from which</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A Fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.23°E., 48 lks. dist., marked T 29 S R 1 E S 27 B T.</p>
