

Retracement of Subdivision Lines of T. 29 S., R. 1 E.

CHAINS	
4.35	Creek, 3 lks. wide, course NW.
5.30	Ravine, course N.; asc. 110 ft. on NE. slope.
8.50	Spur, slopes NE.; desc. 100 ft. on NW. slope.
23.30	Creek, 3 lks. wide, course N.; asc. 35 ft. on NE. slope.
27.00	Low spur, slopes N.; desc. 30 ft. over N. slope, to
40.24	Fall, 20 lks. S. of the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., which is a basalt stone, 4x12x8 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.
	From the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.,
	S.89°43'W., retracing line bet. secs. 24 and 25.
	Gradually descend 30 ft. along N. slope, to
13.15	Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N.; continue gradual descent, 40 ft. over N. slope,
23.35	Creek, 4 lks. wide, course NE.; asc. 370 ft. on SE. slope, to
40.20	Intersect the cor. of secs. 23, 24, 25 and 26, which is a sugar pine, 22 ins. diam., marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.
	The bearing and length of the east half of this line is West, 40.24 chs.; and of the west half, S.89°43'W., 40.20 chs.
	Land; mountainous.
	Soil; clay loam, stony in places, 2nd and 3rd rate.
	Timber; fir, pine, cedar, and hemlock.
	Undergrowth, chinquapin, hazel, vine maple, fir.
	N.89°45'W., retracing line bet. secs. 23 and 26.
	Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
	Ascend 140 ft. on E. slope.
15.65	Ridge, bears NW. and SE.; desc. 285 ft. on W. slope.
36.25	Creek, 1 lk. wide, course NW.; thence over N. slope.
