CHAINS

Cut a cross(x) at exact corner point, for cor. of
Tps. 28 and 29 S., Rs. 1 and 2 E.; with 6 grooves
N., E., S., and W. of cross, from which,
A fir, 7 ins. diam., bears N.37*E., 32 lks.
dist., mkd. T 28 S R 2 E S 31 B T
A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S.64*E., 18 lks.
dist., mkd. T 29 S R 2 E S 6 B T
A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.43*W., 25 lks.
dist., mkd. T 29 S R 1 E S 1 B T
A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N.11*W., 16 lks.
dist., mkd. T 28 S R 1 E S 36 B T

Land; mountainous.

Soil; clay loam, stony in places, 2nd and 3rd rate.

Timber; fir, pine, and cedar.

Undergrowth; chinquapin, fir, hazel, laurel.

North Boundary of T. 29 S., R. 1 E.

From the cor. of Tps. 28 and 29 S., Rs. 1 and 2 E.,
heretofore described.

West, bet. secs. 1 and 36.

Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense
undergrowth.

Desc. 185 ft. on rocky NW. slope.

- 5.25 Foot of descent, on river bottom, bears NE. and SW.
- 12.10 Left bank of South Umpqua River, 100 lks. wide, course
SW.
- 13.30 Right bank of river.
- 18.85 Trail, Tiller to Grasshopper Ranger Station, bears NE.
and SW.
- 27.25 Leave river bottom, bears NE. and SW.; thence over S.
slope.
- 40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in
the ground, for $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.
