Undergrowth; hazel, vine maple, fir.

N.0°07'W., on a random line, bet. secs. 2 and 3.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor.

80.22 Intersect N. bdy. of the Tp., 12 lks. W. of the cor. of
secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, heretofore described.

Thence

S.0°02'E., on a true line, bet. secs. 2 and 3.

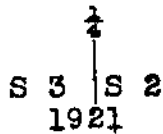
Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense
undergrowth.

Over bench.

3.50 Leave bench, bears NW. and SE.; asc. 30 ft. on ^NE.
slope.

7.30 Spur, slopes SE.; thence over E. slope.

40.22 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the
ground, for $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked

A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.87°E., 20 lks. dist.,
mkd. $\frac{1}{2}$ S 2 B T

A cedar, 30 ins. diam., bears S.39°W., 60 lks. dist.,
mkd. $\frac{1}{2}$ S 3 B T

Descend 130 ft. on SE. slope.

65.70 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course SE.; asc. 10 ft. on NE. slope.

67.00 Small spur, slopes SE.; descend 200 ft. on SE. slope, to

Land; mountainous.

Soil; clay loam, stony in places, 2nd and 3rd rate.

Timber; fir, cedar, pine, and hemlock.

Undergrowth; chinquapin, hazel, fir.
