CHAINS

Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

Asc. 105 ft. on NW. slope.

6.45 Spur, slopes SW.; desc. 635 ft. on S. slope.

25.00 Branch of Rock Creek, 6 lks. wide, course W.; asc. 100 ft. on N. slope, to

27.40 Trail, Tiller to Quartz Mountain Ranger Station, bears E. and W.; asc. 335 ft. on N. slope.

37.00 Spur, slopes NE.; thence over E. slope.

40.17 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked

Descend 30 ft. on SE. slope.

42.00 Head of ravine, course NE.; asc. 175 ft. on NE. slope.

59.00 Ridge, divide bet. Rock Creek and South Umpqua River,
bears NE. and SW.; desc. 35 ft. on SE. slope, to

63.55 Old South Umpqua trail, bears E. and W.; desc. 235 ft.
on SE. slope, to

80.17 The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10.

Land; mountainous.

Soil; clay loam, stony in places, 2nd and 3rd rate.

Timber; fir, cedar, hemlock, and pine.

Undergrowth; chinquapin, manzanita, fir, hazel.
